According to the substantive agenda of the GA High Level Segment **Summit of the Future** it is a priority to strengthen the **Pact for the Future**.

The Foundation for **Subjective Experience and Research S.E.R.** provides the fundament for a PBA, assuming that reconciliation and empathetic perception are indispensable preconditions to get into sustainable peace, with its goal and action plan to **call for reconciliation and peace education to become core competencies in World Education**. It provides a practical and action-oriented approach that ensures sustainable peace and conflict prevention, assuming that **Reconciliation starts before the conflict arises**.

It contributes to the UN and ImPact Coalition for Peace and Security attempts, as it focuses on the human beings and peoples with their demands, chances and abilities to achieve sustainable peace - and it is mainly for our Youth and children, the Future Generations, because the children of today are going to be the leaders, politicians, businessmen/women, teachers, parents and more of tomorrow.

Reconciliation- and Peace education needs to be developed within a holistic approach to education; many factors outside of institutions like schools, kindergartens, universities affect the likelihood of a child enrolling.

The implementation of the S.E.R. Foundation's action plan for implementing Reconciliation and Peace Education as core competencies in World Education is also focused on supporting well-being, global health, personal growth, and development, especially of children and youth, in all aspects of existence.

Reconciliation- and Peacebuilding in the above sense requires efficient education tools as well as empathetic perception and different rituals according to cultures and religions.

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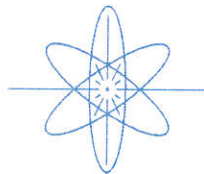

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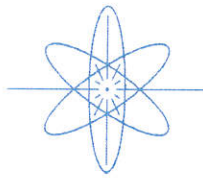
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The **Foundation for Subjective Experience and Research S.E.R.**, NGO in special consultative status with ECOSOC, associated with UN DGC, herewith introduces the following **S.E.R. - Action Plan** as a proposal for Peace achievement, Youth and Future Generations according to **Chapter 2: International Peace and Security of the Pact for the Future**. **It is a Call for action for implementing Reconciliation and Peace Education as core competencies in World Education and a Campaign for Sharing, a call for action towards reconciliation, global health and universal peace.**

It provides a practical and action-oriented approach that ensures sustainable peace and conflict prevention, assuming that

Reconciliation starts before the conflict arises, which means:

- People need to learn how to deal with their own pain and destructive subjective experiences and to reconcile with it.
- Reconciliation means finding ways and methods of cultivating inner peace within each individual from childhood on.
- We see inner peace as a precondition for peace outside oneself / in the world.
- For that reason peace is a basis for all peoples and nations with special focus on youth and future generations, as the children of today are going to be the politicians, leaders, businessmen/women, teachers and more of tomorrow.
- In this context, we are calling for an ImPact for the Pact for the Future in which reconciliation and peace are core competencies of World Education. The resulting assured common ground for sustainable peace would entail a new management strategy, introducing reconciliation and peace as core competencies in a new educational system.

Assuming that reconciliation and empathetic perception are indispensable preconditions to get into sustainable peace it is necessary to embody it as core competencies in World Education by UN resolution –

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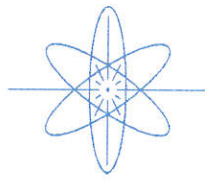

STEP 1:

Conceptualize a curriculum for reconciliation and peace with didactics and methods of empathic perception, teaching and learning for all ages. Create examples, like music projects, collect reconciliation rites worldwide, like "Ho o pono pono", provide training tools like ERGOSOMA International workshop suitcases for empathy training and perception exercises

STEP 2:

Find Kindergartens, schools, universities, adult education centers, colleges, community centers in your home-country/hometown and ask them to test your method, example within a certain timeframe.
Collect these experiences, analyze and evaluate them.

STEP 3:

Submit it to Ministries of Education and /or Governmental Departments.
Ask them to build up the general contents on a national level and implement it in its educational system.

STEP 4:

Draw up a "Resolution for Reconciliation and Peace Education".
Sign it with S.E.R. and partners, with politicians, diplomats, celebrities and start lobbying and promoting it in political and diplomatic circles, as well as in entertainment and film businesses, everyday life and private circles.

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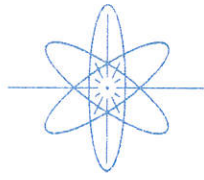
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STEP 5:

Finally find Representatives/Ambassadors of Permanent Missions of supporting countries to the UN, who bring this resolution into the General Assembly to make it mandatory worldwide.

As the S.E.R. Foundation's credo is Reconciliation and Peace, our highest goal is to establish reconciliation and peace as ideal status:

Sustainable Peace in a world without borders through Reconciliation as core competency in World Education.

For this reason, let us take steps together, so that our core goals can become a reality for a peaceful world for our youth and future generations.

SHARING for financing reconciliation and peace education as World Vision - Our suggestions for SHARING

Sharing expresses a voluntary act. It takes dignity, the right to live, of basic rights of the other for granted. It stands for joint use of resources.

Sharing as an indicator for peace development and the role of reconciliation:

- Reconciliation as political dimension to foster global peace and brotherhood
- Sharing as highest form of reconciliation
- Sharing is a high spiritual, social, ethical value
- Sharing to foster humanness in society for sustainable peace, social development and stability

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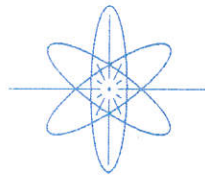
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We propose:

To counteract the existing extremely unbalanced distribution of wealth and to facilitate unconventional actions of the beneficiaries of growth, the S.E.R Foundation proposes - parallel to the measures that the head of states will take –

to launch a **campaign for sharing** within **the Summit for the Future** for financing **reconciliation and peace education** as core competencies **in World Education**.

The campaign should be headed by exemplary acting prominent partners especially from policy, businessmen from the financial sector, representatives of leading enterprises, landlords,

granting a considerable part, for instance ten per cent, of their wealth including property, to a fund, run by the UN or appointed experts of government, civil societies, and NGOs.

Enterprises might also contribute by sharing their profits through converting informal jobs to employment on a permanent basis, reserve a percentage of these jobs for the most disadvantaged groups as youth, women, girls and minorities.

By giving land, people living in rural areas would be enabled to grow plants in order to ensure their livelihood, *ibid*.

A financing of internet access, especially for all women and girls, in remote areas could reduce exclusion through the existing digital divide.

All suggestions above contribute to inner peace of the individual person.

The One hundred (100) richest companies or private men in every country should invest a certain percentage of their fortune in educational, health and reconciliation/peace program to promote reconciliation and peace in World Education.

The FOUNDATION for SUBJECTIVE EXPERIENCE and RESEARCH S.E.R strives to implement the UN Sustainable Development Goals and supports the Summit of the Future Program, especially as said in the Secretary General's vision for the future "Our Common Agenda": (9) A new Agenda for Peace and (10) Transforming Education, as well as supporting and providing ways to Global Health.

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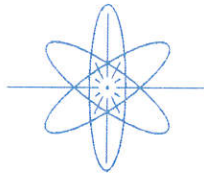
